

Sayyid Al-Hakeem Meets Sadr Al-Yusufiyah Tribal Sheikhs, Says Upcoming Elections Are Decisive Step Toward Lasting Stability

H.E. also warned of the influence of political money on voter decisions, urging all to exercise reason and conscience when making electoral choices to safeguard the nation's and citizens' best interests.
