Sayyid Al-Hakeem Visits Baghdad's Schools: Students Are Nation-Building Foundation, Schools Shape Awareness, Develop Skills

H.E. praised achievements in the education sector while renewing his call to support teachers by providing proper housing and land grants, and by ending the phenomenon of double-shift schools, thereby strengthening the teacher's role and status in shaping future generations.
