Sayyid Al-Hakeem from Karbala: 2025 Elections Are Decisive to Establish Iraq Lasting Stability



From the sacred land of Karbala—where blood triumphed over the sword, where identity, cause, and faith converge—Sayyid Ammar Al-Hakeem, Head of the National State Powers Alliance, met with a group of sheiks, dignitaries, and residents of the holy governorate.

His Eminence called for remembering past achievements and looking ahead with confidence, affirming that neither the past is lost nor the future's dreams are beyond reach, for both carry lessons and wisdom to guide the nation forward. H.E. reiterated that genuine national projects begin on November 11, after which comes the time to reap positive results, recalling the "Karbala, Pride of Iraq" initiative and how it contributed to the city's progress and development.
