

Sayyid Ammar al-Hakim Conveys through the Representative of UN Secretary General a Message that Dealing with Iraq based on its Components Is Unacceptable

Sayyid Ammar al-Hakim, head of the Islamic Supreme Council of Iraq, conveyed through the representative of the UN secretary general a message that the dealing of the countries and organizations with Iraq based on its components is unacceptable. According to him, such dealing must be made through the elected Iraqi government represented by all segments of the Iraqi people. This came during a meeting held on Thursday, May 7, 2015 between his Eminence at his office in Baghdad and the special representative of the UN secretary general in Iraq, Mr. Jan Kubis.
