Al-Hakeem expresses his regret for what the villages of Sinjar suffering and confirms: Iragis deserve much better than that

On Monday 13th of February 2012, Sayeed Amar al-Hakeem, the head of the Islamic Supreme Council of Iraq, visited Sinjar Town in Mosul and expressed his regretted for what the villages of Sinjar suffering, stressing that pluralism is a good source of strength for the Iraqi people as it can be invested to be a national framework under one Iraq.
