Sayyid Al-Hakeem: Iraqis sacrificed heavily to fight dictatorship, terrorism



With Brigade 133 of the Popular Mobilization Forces, Sayyid Ammar Al-Hakeem, Head of Al-Hikma National Movement, shared the iftar meal with the fighters, urging them in his speech to invest the days of the holy month in worship.
