Sayyid Al-Hakeem, During Meeting Joran Tribal Leaders: Iraq Overcame Hardships Through People's Awareness, Religious Authority Guidance



His Eminence, Sayyid Ammar Al-Hakeem, Head of the National State Powers Alliance, met with a group of sheikhs and dignitaries from the esteemed Joran tribe, recalling the long-standing relationship between the Al-Hakeem family and the Joran tribe since the era of Shaheed Al-Mihrab, the Ambassador of the Religious Authority, and Aziz Al-Iraq — may their souls be sanctified.
