

Sayyid Ammar al-Hakim stresses importance of sitting and holding a dialogue instead of being strict, rallying and crisscrossing



Sayyid Ammar al-Hakim has stressed the importance of sitting and holding a dialogue to discuss the problems and demands of the Iraqi people instead of being strict, rallying and crisscrossing, emphasizing his continuous keenness about communication with the political leaders in order to calm matters down and return to the table of dialogue and negotiations. This came up when His Eminence received the envoy of the United Nations to Iraq, Martin Coppler, on Thursday, January 10, 2013 at his Baghdad office.
