n his Meeting with the Turkish Ambassador, Sayyid Ammar al-Hakim Stresses the Need to Promote the Bilateral Relations between both Countries Simultaneously with the Formation of the New Governments in Baghdad and Ankara



Sayyid Ammar al-Hakim, head of the Islamic Supreme Council of Iraq, said it is crucial to build more developed and open relations between Iraq and Turkey in many areas especially as new governments are taking shape in Baghdad and Ankara, reiterating that the promoting the relations between both countries is in the best interest of the both neighbor peoples and countries, not to mention the stability and security in the region.
